 - DEI will show up as an objective in new plan

 - Urgency, low-hanging fruit, timing & budget constraints, external factors, the usual suspects

 - Recommend Immigrant Heritage proclamation to Council
 - Motion Rich, 2nd Doug, passes unopposed
 - Rocky Mountain Immigrant Advocacy Network (RMIAN) as reps
 - Can we get community members to come accept with us?
 - Juneteenth: ask Councilor Obey for recommendation?
 - Miguel suggests Board plans for these further in advance
 - June: Pride, Juneteenth
 - October, Nov: Indigenous Peoples
 - June: Immigrant Heritage

 - Standing item to look for new ones?
 - Something to bring to community
 - Recycle proclamations from previous years,
